"Every life matters!" on Open Mosque Day, which will be held on October 3. By coming together with the motto, we will glorify social peace and compassion. In the hadith we read at the beginning of our khutbah, our Prophet SAW said: "The Compassionate One has mercy on those who are merciful.
